SWEATER WEATHER PLATE



MATERIALS

DB35976 Plain Ugly Sweater Dish
Liner Brush
Detail Brush
Medium Brush
Large Brush
Scissors
NCR Patterns
Red Ballpoint Pen

COLORS

CMM 30 - Red Rocks
CMM 25 - Safari
CMM 13 - Cinnamon Stick
CMM 73 - Honeycomb
CMM 82 - Olive You
CMM 18 - Pumpkin Pie
CMM 88 - Vanilla Bean



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Locate the pattern for the top of the plate. Cut loosely around the pattern to make it easier to line up on the plate.
- 2. Line up the pattern and press firmly as you trace over the following lines with a ballpoint pen to transfer the lines onto your piece:
 - a.Line 1, 2, 3, and 4 (do not trace the pumpkins yet).
- 3. Locate the pattern for the bottom of the plate. Cut loosely around the pattern to make it easier to line up on the plate.
- 4. Line up the pattern and press firmly as you trace over the following lines with a ballpoint pen to transfer the lines onto your piece:
 - a. Lines 6 and 7 (do not trace anything else yet).
- 5. Use a medium brush to fill in the space between lines 3 and 4 with three coats of Vanilla Bean. Then apply three coats of Vanilla Bean to the space between the trim on the sleeves and lines 6 and 7. If it helps, look at the photo for reference. We are painting the cream sections of the sweater.
- 6. Next, use a medium brush to apply 3 coats of Safari to the ribbed trim sections on the plate. These would be around the neck, the bottom, and the ends of the sleeves.
- 7. Apply three coats of Honeycomb to the space between the neck trim and line one, as well as from line 4 to the trim on the body of the sweater. And from line 4 to lines 6 & 7 on the sleeves of the sweater. Looking at the photo for reference, we are painting the main yellow part of the sweater.
- 8. Use a liner brush to paint the space between lines 1 and 2 with three coats of Cinnamon Stick.
- 9. Next, apply three coats of Red Rocks to the space between lines 2 and 3.
- 10. When the plate is dry, line up the pattern again and trace the Pumpkins and line 5 from the top pattern, as well as the hearts, words, and Lines 8 & 9 from the bottom pattern.
- 11. Use a small brush to apply three coats of Pumpkin Pie to the pumpkins. Then, use a liner brush to apply another generous coat of Pumpkin Pie to outline the body of the pumpkin.



INSTRUCTIONS

- 5. Use a liner brush to paint two generous coats of Olive You to the leaves and curly stems on the pumpkins.
- 6. Use a liner brush to paint two generous coats of Cinnamon Stick for the stems on the pumpkins as well as a line on each leaf.
- 7. Next, use a liner brush to apply two coats of Cinnamon Stick to the words, as well as lines 4, 6, and 7 (these are the lighter of the zig-zag stripes).
- 8. Use a liner brush to apply two coats of Red Rocks to the remaining zig-zag stripes (lines 5, 6, and 7).
- 9. Finally, use a detail brush to apply three coats of Pumpkin Pie to the little hearts on the sleeves.

TIPS

- Use the image of the plate as a reference when filling in the sections, especially if the numbers in the instructions become too confusing.
- Three generous coats of paint will give you solid colors.
